

Visitor Guide 2019

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1. Housing

Unfortunately our university does not have a student dormitory. Assistance to find proper housing can furthermore not be guaranteed for all students. Making reservations and finding a guarantor will be the responsibility of the visitor. The rent of private housing depends on location, the length of stay and available services, and costs between 25.000 ~ 95.000 yen a month. Especially for short stays it can be difficult to find economical apartments. For more information please see Kyoto Housing Search.

If you cannot find suitable accommodation near to the university, we advise you to look for a place with a good public transport connection to our university. When you know your address please inform your department and the International Academic Exchange Center. Also please inform us if you change your residence.

2. Registration

If you stay for longer than 3 months you will need to register at your local ward office ($Kuyakush\bar{o}$). Please go within 14 days after your arrival and bring your passport and residence card with you. In case you move, also please report this within 14 days.

3. Insurance

We ask exchange students to make sure they are properly insured during their stay in Japan. If you stay for more than three months in Japan, you are required to enroll in Japanese Health Insurance. In order to enroll, please go to the health section at your local ward office, and bring your residence card and passport. If you move, please make sure to register this, or your insurance might not be valid.

➤ We advise foreign students to have additional insurance for repatriation in case of illness or injury.

You are welcome to join sports and other recreational activities, please do note that unless stated otherwise injuries etc. are at your own risk.

4. Transport

Arrival

Students who will stay for longer than 3 months will receive a registration card when they arrive at Kansai International Airport. From the airport you can take the train (1h 15 min), or bus (1h 25min, 2,550 yen) to Kyoto station. Shared shuttle taxi's drop passengers of directly at their lodgings. Shuttle taxi's need to be reserved in advance. For more information please see the airport's website.

Bus

Several <u>bus lines</u> stop right in front of the University Hospital. If you use the bus daily a monthly commuter pass might be a good option.

Subway

Subway Kitayama station is close to the university's Shimogamo Campus. Marutamachi and Imadegawa stations are about a 20 minute walk from the main campus. For more information on the bus and subway, please see this link.

Train

The Eizan and Keihan railway offer a good connection to the main campus. Just like the bus they offer commuter passes with discount.

At "Hyperdia" you can get more information on timetables, routes and prices of trains.

Bicvcle

Many students use bicycles as a cheap and fast option to get through town. Throughout town there are shops selling second hand bicycles. It is obligatory to register your bicycle at purchase for a fee of 500 yen. Please make sure to keep your registration paper. In case of theft the police will look for your bicycle. The police may stop cyclists to confirm the registration of their vehicle. From April 2018 cyclists are furthermore obliged to have a liability or bicycle insurance.

Please make sure not to park your bicycle in areas which are banned for bicycle parking (near stations and on shopping streets). There is a large risk involved of having to go to a far of location to get your bicycle back for a hefty fee.

Finally, drunk cycling is prohibited and ill advised.

5. Campus Information

Kawaramachi and Hirokoji Campus


The Universities main facilities are located between the Kamo-river and Imperial Palace.

The University Hospital, Clinical Research Building and Basic Medicine, and

administrative offices are located at the Kawaramachi Campus. The School of Nursing and Library are located on the Hirokoji Campus.

Access The Kawaramachi and Hirokoji Campus are within walking distance from Demachiyanagi and Jingu Marutamachi stations on the Keihan line. Marutamachi and Imadegawa stations on the subway Karasuma line, and Shiyakusho-mae on the Tozai line can be reached within 20 mnutes on foot. City buses number 3, 4, 17, 37, 59, 205 stop in front of the University Hospital.

Kyoto Station 25 min. \Rightarrow bus 4, 17, 205 Shijō Kawaramachi 15 min. \Rightarrow bus 3, 4, 17, 205 Sanjō Keihan 10 min. \Rightarrow bus 37, 59



Shimogamo Campus

The facilities at Shimogamo Campus are located within the premises of Kyoto Prefectural University. The premedical courses of the medical school take place here. And it is the location of, amongst others, the departments of biology and chemistry. The campus is a 7 minute walk from Kitayama Station on the Subway Karasuma line. Bus lines number 1 and 206 stop at the nearby stop, *Kyoto Furitsu-Dai Mae*.

The main <u>library</u> is located at the Hirokoji campus.


University COOP


Natural Disasters
